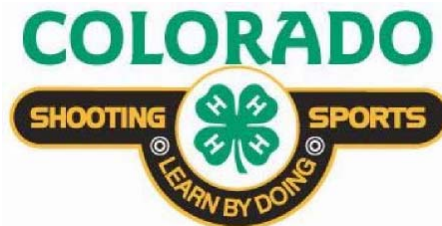

Entries MUST BE registered online. If online is not available, email or fax to Perry Brewer at perry.brewer@colostate.edu or (719) 346-5660 by August 2, 2010. The greatest attempt will be made to get squadding information back to the county by August 16, 2010. Maps for all shooting ranges will be available at your county Extension office, the State 4-H website and 4-H Camp Tobin during the 2010 Colorado State Fair.

DATES: Weekend I: August 21 & 22, 2010
Weekend II: September 4, 5 & 6, 2010

ENTRY FEES: \$5.00 per person, per class for archery, air rifle, .22, and muzzleloading. Shotgun, including trap, skeet and 5-stand is \$15.00 per person per class. Tie-breaking rounds may be additional. There will be a \$2.50 fee per individual contestant for overall contest management and equipment. (Example: if a child shoots in shotgun trap and three classes of air rifle, there is only one \$2.50 fee for the entire state shoot, plus their individual class fees.) *There is no additional charge for team classes.* **County pre-payment of fees is strongly encouraged. Counties who have not paid their entry fees for the previous years shoot, will not be allowed to participate. Individual payments by competitors at check-in will not be allowed.** Payments made on-site must be for entire county delegation. GATE PASSES: Shooting Sports contestants are eligible for one free gate pass for grounds admission to the Colorado State Fair. Counties are responsible for ordering and distributing gate passes to participants. Superintendents will not send passes.

1. Participation information is specified in the 2010 Colorado State Fair 4-H Syllabus and the Colorado State 4-H Shooting Sports Contest Rule Book, 2009/10 edition and the 2010 Supplement. The rule book can be found on line at www.co4hshooting.org under the Colorado State 4-H Shoot. Please be familiar with what is printed.
2. Please register all contestants using the **Online Registration System**. The registration Fee Summary form should be completed and turned in with payment along with your entry forms prior to the competition. Each county (or area) may enter up to six individuals in each senior and junior division event, if eligible.
3. All contestants must have their own, currently valid Colorado Hunter Education card with them at the contest site. All participants will be expected to know and obey all standard NRA range rules and commands. All equipment will be subject to inspection by range officers for safety of function.

4. **SHOOTING EQUIPMENT:** It is expected that each contestant will provide or arrange for his/her own firearm in each competition entered. (This includes shooting mats and other needed equipment.) It is highly recommended that each participant has their own firearm – sharing of firearms makes it very difficult for scheduling members to shoot.
5. **AMMUNITION NEEDED:** It is expected each contestant will provide or arrange for his/her own ammunition (including arrows) in each competition entered. Refer to Colorado 4-H Shooting Sports Contest Rule Book 2009/10 edition and the 2010 Supplement.
6. **EYE AND EAR PROTECTION:** Contestants are required to provide their own eye and ear protective gear. No shooting will be allowed without proper protection. Any exceptions will be noted in the Contest Rule Book.
7. **COUNTY TEAM:** Composed of a maximum of four persons for each event with the exception of shotgun which is a maximum of five persons. Team members must be identified on the registration form. **TEAM MEMBER CHANGES MUST BE FINAL 15 MINUTES PRIOR TO START OF SPECIFIC EVENT** (not the relay, but the overall event). Team members will also be scored as individual competitors. All team members' scores count! (**Note:** Shotgun teams must designate shooter order. Example: Position 1, 2, 3, 4, 5.)

Contestants are requested to be at the shooting range a minimum of 1 hour (60 minutes) prior to their squadded time. Contest will run as close to squadded time as possible, however, no guarantees will be made as to squadding times.

8. **TARGET DISTANCES AND SHOTS:** Please refer to the **Colorado State 4-H Shooting Sports Contest Rule Book 2009/10 edition and the 2010 Supplement**. The rule book can be found under Colorado State 4-H Shoot on line at www.co4hshooting.org

10. The greatest, reasonable attempt will be made to accommodate shooters that are involved in other CSF events. However, it may not be possible, nor is it in any way guaranteed that we can accommodate all contingencies. In addition, shoots, by their nature may or may not run on time and shooters, parents and coaches must be willing and able to adapt to the situation. Shooters, parents and coaches must give careful consideration to over- involvement in a variety of CSF events and the youth's ability to participate in the 4-H shooting sports contest.

It is not possible to shoot all events in one day! No shooting times are guaranteed in any discipline. Please make arrangements accordingly. Overnight stays should be planned for.

Reservations for meals and lodging are NOT to be made on the shooting sports entry form. Reservations should be made using the *Request For Meals and Lodging at 4-H Camp Tobin* form available from your county extension agent.
