

Colorado 4-H Shooting Sports Supplement to the 2009 / 2010 State Fair Contest Rule Book

The following changes to the rulebook will not change rules, only clean up formatting, typos etc...

Page iv – delete Eugene Hust, Pueblo (deceased)

RULE CHANGE # 1

Page 1, # 1 – Delegates – Change to read:

County delegates must:

- #1 – Be an enrolled 4-H member in good standing in the county they are representing
- #2 – Be enrolled in a 4-H Shooting Sports project,
- #3 – Complete all County specified requirements and
- #4 – Have a valid Hunter Education Card (HEC).

HEC numbers must be provided on state contest entry forms.

RULE CHANGE # 2

Page 1, #4 – Teams – Change to read:

Each team, with the exception of shotgun, is made up of a maximum of four (4) members. Shotgun teams are made up of a maximum of five (5) members. Additional registered individuals will shoot as individuals. ~~and individuals from counties with less than four (4) members – five (5) in shotgun events – will shoot as individuals.~~

The remainder of the item will remain as printed in the rulebook.

RULE CHANGE # 3

Page 6, #4 – Change to read:

4. Only open ~~iron~~ sights will be allowed.

RULE CHANGE # 4

Page 7, #9 – Sight Definitions – Change to read:

Sight Definitions: Open: A combination of an open notch (rear) and blade or post (front) sight. A factory installed hood on the front sight will be allowed. Aperture: Must have a rear peep and front globe that have interchangeable peep aperture inserts. (please see Appendix IV for photos.)

RULE CHANGE # 5

Page 8, # 14 – Magazines – Change to read:

Extended capacity magazines protruding more than one (1) inch below the firearm are prohibited. Protruding magazines may not be used as a support.

RULE CHANGE # 6

Page 15, #3 – Change to read:

3. Open ~~iron~~ sights or fiber optic neon enhancement sights and factory installed hooded front sights are allowed. Aperture sights and front globe sights are not allowed.

RULE CHANGE # 7

Page 21 – Compound Bow Limited Class – #2

2. Fixed pin sight only – no levels.

RULE CHANGE #8

Page 26, #7

7. A contestant cannot use a shotgun that has a chamber larger than 12 gauge. Ammunition maximum shell length is two and three-quarter (2-3/4) inches except for .410 ammunition. Maximum shot charge is one and one-eighth (1-1/8) ounce. Recommended ammunition is a standard trap load.

RULE CHANGE # 9

Page 27 – Add #27

27. If a member qualifies in both Team and Individual shoot offs, the member will only shoot off once per event (trap, skeet, 5-stand). Their score from the team shoot off will be used as their individual score.

Page 28, #11 – Delete: Individuals will shoot off first.

Page 30, #11 – Delete: Individuals will shoot off first.

Page 31, #6 – Delete: Individuals will shoot off first.

RULE CHANGE # 10

Page 30 – #8, Sub Item B – Add #7

7. The wrong target is broken with the first shot. (Shooter unintentionally shoots wrong target.)

RULE CHANGE # 11

Page 38 (Illustrations)

Add the word Compound to the caption of the right-hand photos so it reads: Compound Traditional Class Arrow Rests

RULE CHANGE # 12

Page 40 (Target Illustrations)

Bottom right hand target has the wrong class numbers listed. Change the list to class numbers 220, 221, 222, 223.

RULE CHANGE # 13

Page 42 (Target Illustrations)

Under Muzzleloading SENIOR Open Class targets, switch the positions of the bottle target and the circle target in the illustration. Also add the word Sighter next to the top bottle target.
